#### TORONTO CROQUET CLUB HUB ACTIVITIES

The aim of the CNSW Hub Project is to:

"Promote and develop the participation and enjoyment of the mallet sports codes of Association Croquet, Golf Croquet, Gateball and Ricochet..." (CNSW Club Hub Document). There are five Club Hubs in NSW.

The Toronto Hub has developed a calendar of activities, which will endeavour to work towards fulfilling this aim. This will only be achieved if all Hub committees pass on the information sent to them, to allow people to choose what they would like to try. Some activities will be targeted towards certain groups, while others will be open to all, who wish to participate.

So far, Toronto Croquet Club has had an *Introduction to Golf Croquet*, with a U3A group. This group enjoyed their time and coped with a cancellation due to wet lawns, by playing with indoor Gateball equipment on an asphalt netball court to avoid another cancellation, travelling to Mt Sugarloaf Croquet Club to play on dry lawns, and eventually managed three sessions on Toronto courts. Some of these people have indicated an interest in joining to play croquet. On 21 June a group of four players from Nelson Bay Croquet Club came to our Come & Try Gateball day. While it would have been great to have had more "triers," these people enjoyed their introduction to Gateball and have expressed an interest in a follow up day.

There are further Come & Try days for Association and Ricochet planned for July, as well as Come & Try Golf Croquet for the local community.

CNSW will provide appropriately experienced trainers and coaches to deliver workshops in such areas as governance, marketing, and applying for grants to name a few . Once the dates are set for these workshops, information will be forwarded to clubs in the Hub area to enable them to join any that are of interest to them.

Toronto Croquet Club believes this is a great initiative and one that can work to promote and grow the sport of croquet.

# FROM THE BOARD

#### **CROQUET NSW FORUM**

All players are invited to attend the Croquet NSW Forum to be held 5.30–6.30pm, Tuesday 26 July, via ZOOM. The Forum will include a focus on the Club Hubs, which are getting underway with their programs. This will be an opportunity for CNSW Clubs and their members to hear from, and ask questions of, the CNSW Board. #### FINANCIAL YEAR PROPOSAL

Clubs are voting on a proposal from CNSW for a change in the financial year from a July-June year to a calendar year. Why the change?

The main financial business of CNSW is paying affiliation fees to Croquet Australia, running CNSW tournaments and supporting the development of croquet though coach and development programs. All of these activities are run on a calendar year basis. Moving CNSW to a calendar financial year reflects the way we run our business and will lead to a consistent management approach and smoother operation over the year.

The CNSW AGM will need to change from September/October to March/April as the AGM must be held within 5 months of the end of the financial year. Clubs do not need to change their financial year or their fee arrangements. Voting needs to be completed by 25 July and must be submitted on the ballot form sent to each club.

#### MEMBERSHIP OFFICER

After two years as Membership Officer, Jeannette Walsh has decided to move on the other challenges. Jeannette as continued this volunteer role during the Pandemic and her wanderings around NSW. We will miss Jeannette and the conscientious way she has approached this work.

The role takes about 1 hour a week allocating membership numbers to new members on the database. New member data is entered by clubs and occasionally a bit of detective work is required to determine if members have already joined before and therefore have an existing number. #### **NATIONAL INTEGRITY FRAMEWORK (NIF)**


Croquet NSW has adopted the National Integrity Framework. The Framework offers a free online course about the overall framework. You will need to sign up for their e-learning platform at

#### **CROQUET: BUILDING MEMBERSHIP**

**Don't you wish you had tried it earlier!** How many of us have said that we wished we had started playing croquet sooner?

Croquet NSW is focussed on building Croquet in the State, by encouraging and facilitating recruitment to the sport at Clubs across the State. Building and retaining members is critical to the viability and future of our sport, and looking at our current number of lawns, we have the capacity to grow our membership by 25–30%.

We all know what a fun, accessible and challenging sport we play, and we can spread that message to others to join the sport of croquet.

#### **Our Goals**

- to build membership from its current level of 3,000 members in 60 clubs to 3,300 members by June 2023,
- to increase engagement with croquet by the community,
- to highlight the social and health benefits of croquet, and
- to target specific groups to increase the competitiveness, diversity, and community benefits of croquet.

#### **Membership Building Plan**

Membership has been static for 5-10 years, and while we have weathered the Covid storm, it is a good time to build membership. There are a number of factors in place that make this the right time to grow membership:

- we have had a new coaching accreditation system implemented, so the number of beginner coaches has grown,
- we have the capacity for growth; over half the clubs have less than 20 members per lawn,
- there are a number of promotional videos available from the Croquet Academy available for use on social media, websites etc.,
- many clubs have Facebook pages; there is a Croquet NSW Community page group to report activities and stories from clubs, and
- Croquet Australia has offered clubs \$50 per member where there is a net increase between January 2022 and January 2024!

#### **How can my Club participate?** Ask yourself the following questions:

- how many new members have joined my club this year and why?
- does my Club have a current coaching program with active coaches?
- is there enough information, resources, and support for new and existing members?
- what does my club currently do to attract new members?
- can our Club accommodate new members?
- if so, how many? Estimates of club membership density vary from 25-40 members per lawn,
- is my Club connected with our community?
- who is doing the workload at my club?
- is my club doing an OK, good, or a great job with recruitment and retention?
- how can Croquet NSW and Croquet Australia help?

#### Get your club recruitment ready

- plan your recruitment strategy and get commitment from your Committee and Club members. Form a membership sub-committee, or at least 1 person dedicated to this area,
- define your membership targets. CNSW is looking at 10% in 2022/3, and a further 10% after that,
- decide which discipline/s you will recruit for,
- dedicate some annual budget to recruitment initiatives, or look for grants to support your activity,
- build a database or spreadsheet to record potential and new members so that you can track your progress and follow up those who have expressed interest,
- assess the number of coaches and their availability to coach and train new coaches if necessary,
- develop a Beginners coaching course: the Level 1 ACA coaching manuals are a good start and there are other Beginner coaching course outlines available. Refer <a href="https://www.canberracroquet.org.au/learn">https://www.canberracroquet.org.au/learn</a> and
- have a system to mentor new members to successfully integrate them into the Club.

#### Creating Events to attract members, such as:

- Come & Try Days are a tried-and-true way to recruit members,
- Bring a Friend Day: personal introductions can be very powerful,
- Family Fun Day can include fun mallet sport activities and can be set up as part of community events and fairs,
- invite local sporting clubs to have a free fun croquet session at your club, e.g. the tennis, golf, bowls, cricket and netball clubs,
- use social media, local radio, have a free sausage sizzle/breakfast BBQ, or morning/afternoon tea,
- U3A courses are a powerful recruitment tool, and
- there are many more ideas! Share your favourites!

How can Croquet NSW help?

- Croquet NSW can supply brochures to hand out in shopping centres, to local businesses, sport clubs etc.,
- Croquet NSW has banners to help promote your event,
- use the Club promotion resources on the CNSW website,
- contact the Coaching Co-ordinator, Pam Gentle, if you need to train new coaches,
- use CNSW Community or CNSW Facebook page to celebrate your successes, take photos and contact the CNSW newsletter editor to publish your stories,
- use the croquet videos developed by the Croquet Academy. Contact Jon MacFarlane jonmac au@hotmail.com


#### GC PENNANTS - DIVISION 2 & DIVISION 3 - 2022
