FROM THE BOARD

New Member Management System – in progress

A key activity over the next few months is the establishment of a new system for managing information. It is expected that the new system will be easy for all to use and will include club member database; tournament calendar; tournament registration; direct payment system for events, merchandise, annual subscriptions, etc; emailing capability for small or large mailouts; analysing information; club governance; and a range of other functions.

The Board has considered proposals from system designers and has engaged RevSPORTS following their impressive demonstration indicating a good understanding of our requirements. They are NSW-based and are grounded in community sports and competition needs. Check out their website: https://www.revolutionise.com.au/who-we-are/

It is expected that clubs will find that the new system will simplify many of their regular administration and communication needs, and club members will later be able to manage their own information. The new system will be available for all our clubs to join, and to use for their own activity. As we are currently in development stage, please let us know if there are particular functions that your club would like incorporated into the system and this can be considered for inclusion. We would also like to hear from any clubs which would like to test the proposed system before it goes live. Further down the track, CNSW will work with RevSPORT to develop a new, easy-to-use website that will incorporate the access to the member management system.

NEWS FROM STRATHFIELD CROQUET CLUB

Strathfield Croquet Club (SCC) started this year with great enthusiasm and is looking forward to celebrations during 2024 to mark the Club's 120th anniversary. During recent years efforts to promote the club locally have seen club membership increase rapidly and there are now players in all forms of the sport. Wider promotion has seen the successful establishment of a 'Club Hub' to promote the wider development of croquet skills and activities. There is much to celebrate and to engage club members and guests within a supportive and inclusive environment. Participation in all forms of croquet is growing as is the numbers of members who are playing competitively, improving their skills, and helping to promote the sport locally and beyond. Golf croquet (GC) is a popular introduction to croquet; social playing sessions are well attended; and two teams recently participated in the Division 3 Pennant Competition and are busy preparing for the Makara competition later this year. Association (AC) and Ricochet (RC), while smaller in numbers, have loyal players who are attracting interest and participation from club members. Across all codes, players are improving their playing handicaps, and gaining skill as coaches and referees. Recently, our Club Captain, Petula Shun, was tournament referee at the inaugural ACA Ricochet open doubles and singles competition held at Tempe. Gateball (GB) is proving a popular activity within the club, with a program of regular competition. A recent invitational competition saw 6 teams participate from across the State with the Newcastle team the winners. A great time was had by all. The Strathfield Hub is encouraging participation and is offering opportunities to other croquet clubs to try GB. The Strathfield HUB has been very busy this year consolidating its activities. Several workshops have been conducted to improve skills in GB, GC, and RC and to support other activities such as record-keeping both within and beyond the club. A workshop to explain advantage play was completed and this is now being tried during social play to encourage more even play. Future workshops for coaching accreditation, introduction to GB, and GC rules and techniques, are being planned and are open to other clubs. Term 3 will see croquet offered to a local high school with coaching and support provided by club members. All in all, SCC is a busy vibrant club that is developing strong links within the local community as well as the wider croquet community. (photos below show the Club's new shirts)

WINNERS ARE GRINNERS STATE FINAL OF THE BERYL CHAMBERS HANDICAP (AC) CHAMPIONSHIP, 9-12 June, Tempe

14 AC players from around the State converged on Tempe for this year's event. The players were divided into two blocks of 7 players and being a handicap event, bisques were in plentiful supply.

The top two from each block went on to contest the finals.

The quarter finals results were Ted Woodley def Simon Cook 18/16; Wafik Nassif def Fiona Gale 16/6; Paul Skvorc def Ken Green 22/21; and Julie Toms def Roberta Flint 17/8.

The semi-final results were: Ted Woodley defeated Wafik Nassif in a very close game 23/21, and Julie Toms defeated Paul Skvorc 17/13. The final came down to Ted Woodley Hcp 2.5 and Julie Toms off 12. In a high scoring final, Ted, although giving away 9½ bisques, got up 26/20 to continue the trend of low markers winning this event. Paul Skvorc finished third winning 26/9 against Wafik Nassif and Robert Barrie won the plate.

CNSW ACA (GC) BRONZE MEDAL, 23-25 June, Tempe

The Bronze Medal was contested in near-ideal conditions - bright, cool and with only moderate breezes. There were many high-quality and hard-fought games, a large proportion going to the thirteenth hoop, and engrossing to watch. The last complete match was played between the top seeds - Jamie Gumbrell and Pete Landrebe. In the third game, Jamie equalised by running the twelfth hoop; then rushed that ball to the north boundary, but much closer to the midway line than to the line on the thirteenth, while Pete had a close runner on the final hoop, shielded by his partner ball. Jamie then achieved her only option - a 45 degree hoop from the boundary - a fitting way to win such a fine tournament. Pete Landrebe (runner-up) and Malcolm Powys (third) each finished with 5 wins and 2 losses. Pete had the unusual score line of 8-2 in one game, running hoops 9 and 10 in one stroke. Notably, Malcolm (who filled a vacancy in the draw only at the last moment) defeated Pete in his first match and Jamie in his last (completed after the Medal was decided, with an immaculate 7-0 win over the Medallist!). Jamie (who also won the Bronze Medal last year) will go on to play in the Australian Golf Croquet Gold & Silver medal playoffs in Perth in September this year.
