Wednesday **7 February** is the last day for the CNSW Secretary to receive notice of Special Resolutions, Wednesday **14 February** is the last day to receive nominations for the CNSW Board, Officers and Committees, and Wednesday **21 February** is the last day for receiving Other Business for inclusion on the Agenda. On **22 February** the Agenda will be circulated to Club Secretaries and Delegates, and on **28 February** the 2024 Annual Report will be distributed to Clubs and Delegates.

FROM THE BOARD

The Croquet NSW Board has handled many important issues over recent months, and some of these are covered elsewhere in this newsletter.

2024 Budget

The Treasurer has presented the 2024 Budget which was accepted by the Board. The Board has approved an increase in funding for the gardens and surrounds at CNSW Tempe Headquarters. The budget of \$5,000 is subject to review by the Facilities Management Committee which will report to the February Board meeting with its recommendations.

Mackey Park

The CNSW Headquarters is within Mackey Park and the Inner West Council is considering what arrangements are required to best utilise this valuable Crown Land for all sporting clubs who wish to use the park. The future of the Concordia

Club building, which houses the CNSW office and amenities, is currently being assessed and any change such as renovation/rebuild will impact croquet players significantly. Also, the Board is mindful of the fact that any renovation/rebuild will impact on the surrounds, and this will be taken into account before allocating expenditure to the gardens and surrounds. A meeting on the current status of the POM will be held with IWC on 14 February 2024.

Court Lighting

Cooks River CC and CNSW have submitted a grant application for the installation of lighting on all 4 courts at Tempe. If successful this will enable summer play to be held in the evening, for tournaments to be completed over fewer days, and for working people to attend croquet after work.

Office of Sport, Organisation Support Program

NSW Office of Sport, Organisation Support Program has funds available for eligible organisations. Female Participation is one of the key policy and strategy areas for the Office of Sport and aligns well with croquet membership and participation initiatives. Current female membership is around 66%. CNSW Chair and Secretary will attend a workshop with the Office of Sport and follow up as necessary with Clubs.

Referees

The lack of referees, especially in golf croquet, has resulted in discussions regarding why experienced players are not putting their hands up to do the qualification. Consultation on the training and testing process is underway and recommendations will be put forward as to the approach to assist potential referees to complete the necessary qualifications.

Volunteers

The Board has been busy preparing for the AGM, and as we look back to 2023, we see what a busy year it was for croquet in NSW. So many Clubs held their own tournaments, friendship days with other Clubs, and come & try days, and we see the overall number of members grow each year. This does not happen without the efforts of wonderful volunteers. It was also a busy and successful year for CNSW tournaments and national tournaments and once again these cannot happen without our volunteers.

In relation to CNSW tournaments, it is pleasing to see Clubs volunteer to hold events in 2024. Many of these Clubs are in the rural and regional areas which provides an opportunity for competitions to be held outside the metropolitan area. Stephen Burns, CNSW Director

As we near the AGM and wind up the past year's activities, I have been checking in on our committees and officials to see who is willing and able to continue in their roles. Most are continuing, but a good number would like to hand their duties on. The list of officials and committee members is listed below, with vacancies highlighted, and those roles where the holder is probably looking to move on in the near future.

Board positions are held for one year and can be elected for no more than five consecutive terms. Committees and Officials are appointed by the Board for one year, and can be re-appointed for up to five years. We are currently looking for a number of critical roles (position descriptions listed below)

- State Director Coaching
- State Director Refereeing (Golf Croquet)
- State Director Refereeing (Association Croquet)

Please consider putting your hand up for one of these roles, or perhaps offering to do part of what is required, and we can look at sharing the role. Other opportunities exist in Selection, Facilities Management or Tournaments where you can contribute as part of a team. The current Board members are listed and there is one vacancy on the Board currently, which is likely to be the role of Treasurer. The Board agrees on who is undertaking which office on the Board after the Directors are elected at the AGM. So thanks for what you do and consider taking on one of the vacancies listed. Role Descriptions

State Coaching Coordinator

The role of the State Coaching Coordinator is to:

- a) Coordinates the training, accreditation, and reaccreditation of coaches within NSW for all croquet codes.
- b) They maintain and approve the list of accredited coaches within NSW.
- c) They Coordinate the availability of coaching resources accreditation requirements; coaching manuals; badges etc
- d) They liaise with Croquet Australia (including the Croquet Academy) to ensure appropriate representation regarding coaching matters for Croquet NSW.

State Directors of Refereeing

Each of the State Directors of Refereeing shall, in their respective areas:

- a) Be a qualified referee,
- b) Recommend to the Board appointment of persons to conduct examinations of members wishing to qualify as referees such persons to be known as State Examining Referees AC or State Examining Referee GC.
- c) Supervise the duties of the State Examining Referees.
- d) Keep records of referees, umpires, and examinations, including a referee and umpire register, and keep website list of referees up to date.
- e) Appoint tournament referees as required for C NSW events.
- f) Organise/conduct appropriate training and refresher courses to keep referees and umpires up to date with rules, regulations, and any other developments.
- g) Ensure there are sufficient examining referees, attention being given to the appointment of referees in urban and regional areas.
- h) Make approaches to each club without a qualified referee, with advice and assistance to interested members considering referee and umpire qualifications.
- i) Report to the Board as scheduled.

CROQUET NSW ANNOUNCES NEW WEBSITE

Croquet NSW is moving to a new website from 4 April 2024.

We have signed an Agreement with Sports Grid to build a RevolutioniseSPORT (RevSPORT) powered website. We will subsequently also operate under the RevSPORT Management Platform which will organise and store our club, player, event data and more.

Croquet NSW has been very well served by its current website, which has delivered a very workable and functional website, including membership, club, tournament, and related data for the use of NSW Clubs and their members. We owe a large debt to David Archer for his work on building, maintaining this database and website over the last 19 years. We will transition to the new website in April with the database functionality following in July. The website will provide dynamic news and event information, Club finder and all necessary website information. Croquet Australia will also be using the RevSPORT platform, so the data transition is timed to work with their current timeline.

Clubs will be able to access member data through the new CNSW website, or by signing up with RevSport themselves. Timeframes and costs for this phase will be announced over the coming months but are expected to be modest.

Existing player and Club data will be downloaded from the current CNSW database, so clubs and players are encouraged to update their information between now and June 2024. Briefing and training sessions will be available to CNSW Clubs and players to assist in the transition, and to familiarise clubs with the new functionality available.

The Platform is used by 270 governing bodies as well as over 17,500 grassroots clubs & associations across 8 countries. RevSPORT is the market leader for data management for sporting organisations in Australia and is an Australian-based company. They are renowned for the ease of use of the platform, for their user-friendly service and for their professional standards and reasonable cost structure. More news to come as this exciting new phase unfolds.

ARBITRARY CHANGES IN HANDICAPS

It is timely to visit the practice of making arbitrary changes in handicaps.

A player's handicap should only be changed as a result of an AHS trigger or through judgement (by an experienced eye) of their current playing standard and trajectory.

If a tournament manager wants to accept players into an event so as to swell numbers or give opportunities to developing players, they should just change the entry requirements. Entering a tournament shouldn't result in a preemptive change in the players' handicaps. If the situation was mirrored at the other end, it would be bizarre to downgrade a player from a -3 to a 1 just so they can enter a tournament restricted to positive handicaps.

Tournament entry requirements are completely arbitrary: well equilibrated handicaps/indexes are not.

Tournament managers should encourage higher handicap players to participate in competitions. So being flexible and aspirational with tournament entry requirements is to be commended, but fiddling with the AHS for individuals outside of their merits is unacceptable.

The live streaming is to be undertaken by Happy Cam Sports and will be available free on the Happy Cam Sports YouTube account (just use the YouTube search function) and on the CNSW Facebook page. Streaming will be the semi-finals and the finals of each event, commencing at 8am.

Following the trial, the CNSW Board will consider the merits of any future live streaming of CNSW events based on the quality of the telecast, any technical challenges, the audience participation, and cost.

2024 MEMBER PROTECTION INFORMATION OFFICER (MPIO) WORKSHOPS

The Office of Sport's popular MPIO workshops will return in 2024. MPIOs play a vital role in protecting the rights and welfare of club members as the 'go to' person to raise issues, concerns and complaints. The Office of Sport will host four webinars during February and March. The training involves two free components:

- 1. Play by the Rules online MPIO module hosted on the Sport Integrity Australia e-learning hub.
- 2. Office of Sport webinar session a two-hour practical session.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS (WWCC) - RENEWALS GO DIGITAL

It is important to remember that all Coaches must have a current WWCC. A Working with Children Check (WWCC) lasts for five years and then needs to be renewed. You can now skip the queue and digitally renew your WWCC in as little as 10 minutes. Online renewals remove the need to visit a Service NSW Centre. The new process is streamlined, efficient and secure and will become the go-to renewal method to easily meet their compliance obligations. Enabled by photo verification tech, the process delivers a high-level of security by ensuring the images are destroyed after the real-time check is completed, without the hassle of submitting physical documents. Since launching late last year, more than 3000 customers have successfully renewed their WWCC online and 98% of those who provided feedback gave a 'thumbs up' to the online experience.

The event was as a best-of-three games round robin which came down to Addison vs Ethan which Ethan won 7/6 7/6 to remain undefeated and the Gold Medal winner. Addison finished with the Silver medal, losing only one match. Congratulations Ethan and so close for Addison. Peter won two games to finish third while Jamie and James gained valuable experience and will both be big improvers next year.

U21 GOLF DOUBLES & SINGLES, 13-15 January, Maitland Croquet Club

The Gold medal players were joined by Tim Wright (QLD), Michael & Daniel McLean (VIC) and Micah Hamilton (VIC). The Doubles was a round robin event. 
