POSITION STATEMENT

Croquet NSW, Incorporated (referred to in this appendix as the "Association") condemns the use of performance enhancing drugs and doping practices in croquet because they are contrary to the ethics of croquet and potentially harmful to the health of players.

POLICY ADOPTED BY CNSW

Croquet NSW adopts the anti-doping policy that the Australian Croquet Association (Croquet Australia) has adopted and placed in force. Croquet Australia adopts the policy that the Australian Sports Commission has from time to time, in force so by extension therefore Croquet NSW adopts the ASC policy.
